PRESCRIPTION MEDICATIONS & PATIENT SAFETY

Medication errors result in a significant portion of dental liability claims. Patient harm can result from known risks, adverse or allergic reactions, drug interactions, and errors in prescribing. Careful attention to detail in prescribing and monitoring the use of medications promotes patient health and safety.

1. Medication reconciliation is performed on a routine basis, including the use of herbal supplements and over-the-counter drugs.
